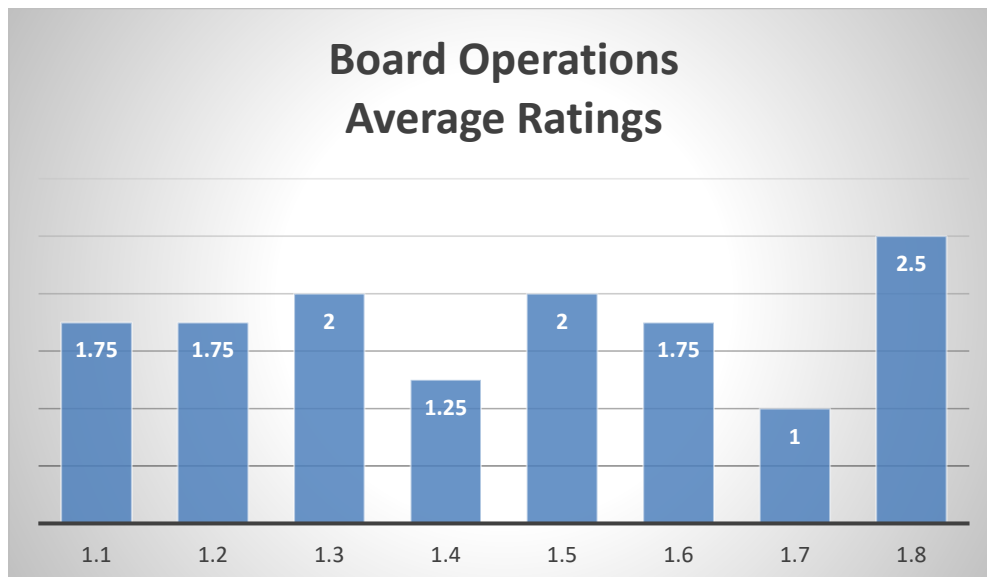
<u>1</u>	<u>O</u>	I (we) operate at an optimum level of performance.

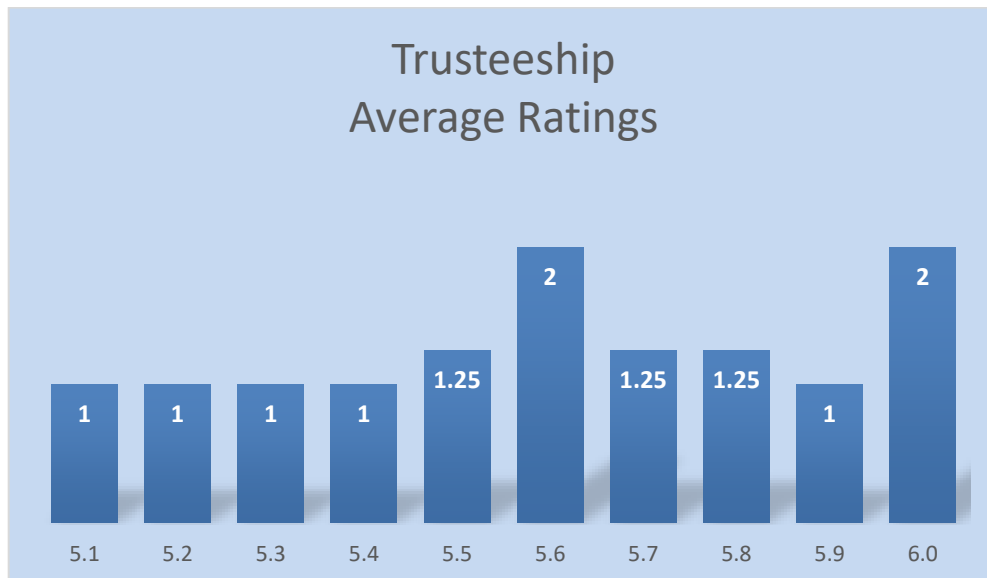


## 5. TRUSTEESHIP
