

Instructions for Individuals who are not Intermountain Healthcare Employees with COVID Exposures

(Suppliers, Affiliated Providers, Temps, Students, etc.)

***Prompt reporting and prompt response is essential. Post exposure treatment may be necessary and must be started as soon as possible.**

| After exposure | |
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| <p>Individual Should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Doff personal protective equipment, wash hands. • Immediately contact the Intermountain Healthcare nurse manager, school instructor, preceptor, or Intermountain Healthcare Employee Health Nurse to determine exposure risk • Report the incident to your employer or sponsoring agency • Coordinate all follow-up care through your employer or sponsoring agency • Coordinate follow-up COVID testing through your employer or sponsoring agency • If the exposure is deemed high risk or moderate risk, the CDC recommends: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Stay home and isolate. Have your family isolate from you in home ○ Get tested with any symptoms or at 7 days ○ If you are positive for COVID-19, please inform your clinical instructor | <p>Intermountain Healthcare (Employee Health Services when available) will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immediately help assess exposure risk • Provide guidance/support for obtaining testing in your area <p style="color: red;">Contact AskHR to evaluate if there has been an exposure to other caregivers or patients.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Phone: 801-442-7547, or toll-free 833-442-7547 <li style="padding-left: 20px;">Hours: 8:00am to 5:30pm - Email: AskHR@imail.org |
| Other Injuries or Illnesses | |
| <p>Individual Should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immediately contact Intermountain Healthcare manager, school instructor, preceptor, and/or the Employee Health Nurse to report injury or illness. • Students should report immediately to the Emergency Department for life threatening or serious injuries or exposure to bodily fluids • Report injury or illness to your employer or to your sponsoring agency to coordinate care with your employer's worker's compensation provider • Coordinate follow-up injury or illness care through your employer or sponsoring agency | <p>Intermountain Healthcare (Employee Health Services when available) will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide you with first aid treatment • Provide referral resources as needed • Provide guidance/support for obtaining post-exposure baseline lab testing, which should be drawn at the time of injury • Provide guidance/support for obtaining post-exposure baseline lab testing from known source person <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Unit supervisor where exposure occurred should get source person consent for lab testing ○ All post-exposure baseline lab results will be reported to exposed individual through the ordering provider (such as Employee Health or Emergency Department) |
