Treasurer's Report

The YTD budget is \$50,882 with \$48,140 of the budget committed to activities and projects. To-date \$31,145 has been spent on those activities. The remaining budget is **\$19,737** (Budget \$ less Actual \$ spent) for approved activities and any new ones. Listed below are details for recently completed activities or those in progress:

- **ConCom (March 30):** Pop ups were purchased at Home Depot (\$1,408), Facilities has these in storage for the event.
- **SAC Swag:** All the items have been received and are in the Dean's Office. These will be moved to the Prize Wheel table for ConCom. Items were ordered from 4imprint (\$2,628):
 - Can Koozies (Qty 500)
 - Stylus Pens (Qty 1,000)
 - 4-color Pens (Qty 500)
 - T-shirts (Black, varying sizes)
- **No More Week (March 6 – 12):** Budget was \$350 for door prizes and refreshments, \$169 was spent.
- **College Daze (April 13):** \$4,500 was approved at the February meeting, to-date \$2,670 has been spent, \$1,830 remaining in the budget for the event. Listed below are the items that have been purchased

Discussion/Voting Item – Nature Trail & Disk Golf Course Clean Up (Friday, April 22, 8am to Noon)

- **Discussion & Notes from the February Meeting:**
 - SAC typically sponsors an event in the spring to clean up the Nature Trail. Facilities provides the tools, SAC coordinates student/faculty/staff volunteers and provides refreshments.
 - The last clean-up was in April 2019. \$500 was budgeted for refreshments and supplies, actual spent was \$257. At this time, an additional \$1,600 was budgeted for disc golf and trail improvements. A total of \$980 was spent on new golf baskets, signs and misc. supplies.
 - Participants: Local high schools need to be contacted, students need community service hours. Shannon will contact high school athletic teams. Needs to be on Friday or Saturday for high schools. Dan coordinates work that needs to be done. Dan will talk to Frank Sagasta (Desert Star Coach). Shannon will contact MHS & River Valley after date is confirmed with Frank. At the December 2021 meeting, PTK mentioned that they would like to participate this year.

Discussion Item – Denim Day Event (April 27)

- **Discussion & Notes from the February Meeting:**

- Denim Day is the longest-running sexual violence prevention and education campaign in history. The campaign began after the Italian Supreme Court overturned a rape conviction because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans she must have helped the person who raped her remove her jeans, thereby implying consent. The following day, the women in the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in solidarity with the victim. Every April MCC supports the Denim Day campaign to bring awareness to victim-blaming and destructive myths that surround sexual violence. This year, Denim Day is on April 27.
- For the 2019/2020 academic year, SAC budgeted
 - \$400 (\$119 actual): On October 7, 2019, SAC hosted a presentation by the Ft. Mohave Indian Tribe Domestic Violence Program. There was no charge for the speaker, \$119 was spent on refreshments.
 - \$999 (\$348 actual): The Compliance Office (Michelle Martin) coordinated the March 2020 No More Week events. There was a walk on campus, t-shirts were purchased that students could paint (airbrush) in support of the event. The remaining supplies are in the storage room.
