A. Future Events

i. SAC Fall Bash

This event will welcome students to campus and kick off Latinx Heritage Month in the fall semester. The date is to be determined and a budget to not exceed \$4,500 for food, entertainment, prizes, and decorations was proposed.

Le Ann Flores Gomez motioned, and Justin Begay seconded, to approve holding a SAC 2022 Fall Bash in the Fall Semester with a budget not to exceed \$4,500.

ii. Fall Student Conversation Session with President

Typically, these informative sessions with the College President are hosted on the campus and food is provided to students by the LHC SAC. The date is to be determined and the budget should not exceed \$300 for food, cutlery, tableware, and incidentals.

Aliccia Braaten motioned, and Caitlyn Raymond seconded, to approve a budget not to exceed \$300 for food, cutlery, and tableware, for the Fall 2022 Student Conversation Session with the President.

iii. Fall Pumpkinfest

The annual Pumpkinfest is cohosted by the LHC SAC and the MCC LHC Campus. It is a community outreach event to showcase the campus, introduce staff and student volunteers, establish the college as a fun, welcoming environment, be a service to the community, and provide a safe environment for seasonal trick-or-treat activities. Typically, there are games and activities for children and their families, candy, and a photo booth. The event is to take place on Friday, October 28, 2022 and a budget of \$4,800 is set for food entertainment, decorations, and prizes.

Alex Bingham motioned, and Caitlyn Raymond seconded, to approve a budget not to exceed \$4,800 for food, entertainment, decorations, and prizes for the Pumpkinfest event.

iv. London Bridge Days Parade

Each year the Lake Havasu City community enjoys the London Bridge Days Parade that includes various schools and organizations, floats, and marching bands geared toward boosting the city's community pride. MCC staff, faculty, and students participate annually in this event to highlight the college and its many student activities. This year's parade is scheduled for Saturday, October 29, 2022. A budget

not to exceed \$2,500 for decorations, themed attire, and beverages for students, staff, faculty, and guests who walk in the London Bridge Days Parade.

Justin Begay motioned, and Aliccia Braaten seconded, to approve a budget of \$2,500 to purchase decorations, themed attire, and beverages for the students, staff, and faculty, who volunteer to walk in the London Bridge Days Parade.

v. MCC Shines

MCC Shines is cohosted by the LHC SAC and the MCC LHC Campus. This is a community outreach to showcase the campus, introduce campus staff and student volunteers, establish college as a fun, welcoming environment, be a service to the community, and provide an enjoyable holiday event for the community. The event typically offers entertainment, food, a holiday tree-lighting ceremony, and a contest for the best decorated tree. This is a volunteer effort by departments and student clubs. The date is set for Thursday, December 1, 2022 and a budget not exceed \$4,500 for food, entertainment, and decorations.

Justin Begay motioned, and Le Ann Flores Gomez seconded, to approve a budget not to exceed \$4,500 for food, entertainment, and decorations for the MCC Shines.

vi. Spring Student Conversation Session with President

Typically, these informative sessions with the College President are hosted on the campus and food is provided to students by the LHC SAC. The date is to be determined and a budget not to exceed \$300 for food, cutlery, tableware, and incidentals.

Justin Begay motioned, and Caitlyn Raymond seconded, to approve a budget not to exceed \$300 for food, cutlery, and tableware, for the Spring Student Conversation Session with the President.

vii. SAC Spring Bash

This is a fun event that the LHC SAC hosts to welcome students back to the spring semester. The date is to be determined and a budget not to exceed \$4,500 for food, entertainment, prizes, and decorations.

Aliccia Braaten motioned, and Justin Begay seconded, to approve holding a SAC Spring Bash in the 2022-2023 Spring Semester with a budget not to exceed \$4,500.

viii. Food for SAC Meetings

Historically, the SAC has provided food and refreshments at regular on-ground SAC meetings. A budget of \$1,050 to purchase food, beverages, and incidentals at a recommendation of \$150 per meeting for the Fall 2022 academic semester.

Caitlyn Raymond motioned, and Justin Begay seconded, to approve a budget amount of \$1,050 to purchase food, beverages, and incidentals for regular SAC

meetings through the end of Fall 2022 academic semester at a recommendation of \$150 per meeting.
