A. MCC Shines Events Committee Proposal

The Campus Events Committee would like to request additional funds from SAC for our annual MCC Shines event. We had previously allotted a budget of \$4500; however, the new lighting tree that was purchased took over 60% of that budget. With that being said, the proposal asks for compensation on the tree purchase, as well as club funds for the top 3 decorated trees in 500 with a total budget of \$3450.

Vice President Braaten motioned, and Jen Starikov seconded, to approve an additional budget of \$3450 for MCC Shines.

B. Telesis Preparatory Academy Door Decorating Contest Proposal

The administration office at Telesis Preparatory Academy has asked if members of the Student Activities Council would be willing to sponsor and judge their semesterly Door Decorating Contest. Sponsorship would be in the form of purchasing \$5 Starbucks gift cards and the judging would consist of students going to Telesis to judge the decorations on each participating class's door. The event is October 28th, 2022 at 8:00 a.m. The proposal is for no more than \$175 in gift cards, which would amount to 35 cards to give to the winning class.
