- 2023-2024 SAC Elections – Information will be sent out in April regarding elections for the 2023-2024 academic year. Refer to the Student Life Handbook for more information on the process.
- Blaze – How can we use Blaze to engage students at campus and community events?
- Bighorn Trek (ConCom) – This year's event is scheduled for March 30, from 10am to 3pm on the Bullhead Campus. Members of the public and students at the junior high, high school, and college levels will enjoy a festive atmosphere a job fair, music, food and other activities. We will be reaching out to all student clubs, volunteers will be needed to help set up, clean up and participate at other activities during the event (student ambassadors, club information booths, etc.).
