Two of the club members were able to attend the Phi Theta Kappa Regional event at South Mountain Community College where they were able to meet with other Phi Theta Kappa members and learn more about college projects. The club is looking into working on a college project for officer stipends. This would benefit all clubs across all campuses and hopefully bring in more interest from students to join clubs.
