VI. **Old Business**

A. **Spring Bash Recap**

- i. Jasmine Garcia opened discussion for the Spring Bash Recap. Each event went well, and the only improvement mentioned was clarifying communication with new vendors on where to go for events. Jasmine thanked everyone on the committee for their participation and help.

VII. **New Business**

A. **Flagpole Proposal**

- i. SAC would like to purchase a new flagpole for special interest flags to be flown in representation of the student body. Facilities has provided a quote for a 20ft flagpole at \$2,300. Installation of the pole would run around \$300.
- ii. Melissa Martinez moved, Aliccia Braaten seconded, to approve a budget of \$2,600 for a new flagpole.

B. **Pride Month Celebration for June**

- i. SAC would like to celebrate pride month from June 1-30, 2023. SAC is requesting a budget not to exceed \$100 for decorations.

- i. SAC would like to request a budget of \$600 dollars for the Clothes Closet/Food Pantry set up. These funds would be used to purchase various sizes of undergarments, shelves, and any other necessities in starting up.
- ii. Melissa Martinez moved, Le Ann Flores Gomez seconded, to approve a budget of \$600 for the Clothes Closet and Food Pantry Setup.

D. Advisor of the Year

- i. SAC would like to recognize a club advisor by presenting them with a plaque at the Student Recognition Ceremony. SAC is requesting a budget of \$100.
- ii. Melissa Martinez moved, Aliccia Braaten seconded, to approve a budget of \$100 for an Advisor of the Year award.
- iii. Adam Romano asked if the executive board will be gathering input for the award. Jasmine Garcia explained that this time around, the executive board will be deciding on their own, but if the award continues, voting can be opened to all students.

E. Nerd Herd Gaming Night Proposal

- i. Bighorn Nerd Herd would like to host a game night May 5, 2023, and is requesting a budget not to exceed \$240.
- ii. Adam Romano moved, Aliccia Braaten seconded, to approve a budget not to exceed \$240 for the Bighorn Nerd Herd Game Night on May 5th.
- iii. Melissa Martinez asked if the Nerd Herd would promote Tip-A-Nurse during the event, which they agreed to.

F. Surgical Technologist Club AST Conference Proposal

- i. The Surgical Technology Club is requesting funds from SAC to attend their annual conference in Chicago, Illinois from May 24-28, 2023. The attending students will use this opportunity to attend lectures and a student forum, which can assist in preparation for their certification exams. The students plan on bringing the information they collect back to their fellow members in efforts to promote the club and in preparation of certification exams.
- ii. Adam Romano moved, Aliccia Braaten seconded, to approve \$2,800 for the Surgical Technologist Club AST Conference.
