ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)	CONCURRENT	DUAL CREDIT
Advanced Placement (AP) prepares students to pass the AP test to earn college credit. College credit is awarded solely on the student's performance on this one exam and may transfer to colleges as an elective or required credit based on the student's program of study and the college/university the student plans on attending.	Concurrent college classes are taught outside of normal school hours, typically not on the high school campus. Students may have to pay tuition for taking concurrent college classes.	Dual Enrollment courses allow students to receive a high school and college grade and credit for the work performed throughout the school year. Dual enrollment classes have the same seat-time as a typical high school class, during high school hours by qualified high school teachers.
Students will have exam scores provided by College Board	Students will have a college transcript with credits earned.	Students will have a high school transcript and a college transcript.

Concurrent courses take place in a college environment. It is the student's responsibility to establish a study routine during High School that they can continue in college. If you are planning to attend an out-of-state community college or university, check with that institution to see how credits will transfer.
Advanced Placement (AP) exams typically incur exam costs. Check with your local high school about AP Exam fees.	Students may have to pay tuition, fees and books for taking concurrent college classes. Students may be able to receive tuition assistance via MCC's Early Start Scholarship or WAVE JTED funding.	Dual enrollment classes at MCC are free for high school students.

How do I transfer my college credits to another institution?

- As a Dual Enrollment or Concurrent student, you are a registered MCC student. You will have a college transcript. You will need to request **official transcripts** to be sent to any other institution you will be attending. Official Transcripts can be requested by visiting the Registrar's Office, [Outgoing Transcript Request Information](#) on the Mohave.edu website.

Can I transfer my college credits back to my high school if I take classes concurrently?

- Students will need to check with their high school registrar to make sure courses transfer back for high school credit.
- If you need these credits to graduate high school, request your MCC transcripts in a timely manner or speak with your high school counselor about graduation requirements
- Unofficial MCC transcripts can be accessed and printed through the student's myMohave Self-Service <https://mohave-ss.colleague.elluciancloud.com/Student/>
- Your school may require official transcripts, check with your high school registrar's office for more information: Official Transcripts can be requested by visiting the Registrar's Office, [Outgoing Transcript Request Information](#) on the Mohave.edu website.

How do I request my AP Exam Scores to be sent to MCC or other institutions?
