He transitioned to administration by performing doctoral studies in Higher Education Administration with a focus on community colleges at ISU, also serving as a grad assistant for the Higher Ed Administration Department and as an Academic Advisor for the College of Education while attending school.

At Mohave CC, he has served in a number of positions. In 2015, a college reorganization created the CTE Division where Jason has served since its inception. He oversees CTE programs that include Auto Collision and Auto Service, Carpentry, Culinary Arts, Electrical, HVAC, and Welding. He also oversaw the Noncredit offerings of the college for a time, which included oversight of all lifelong learning offerings as well as workforce training courses. It also oversaw the Small Business Development Center for Mohave County.

In addition to the development of new program offering, Jason seeks to develop competency-based programming in the technical trades in both credit and noncredit formats that are both based on industry-identified needs and also provide flexible scheduling options for students. The Advanced Manufacturing Training Center is being designed with this goal in mind with the plan to be the premier technical training facility in the Northwest Arizona region.
