Ironically, the Apache peoples of the Southwest had once welcomed the arrival of the Americans as a buffer against Mexico, which regularly attacked Apache settlements—but then American miners and loggers began to encroach, and a defensive war turned into a terrible guerrilla campaign that lasted a quarter-century. In this talk, Gregory McNamee, who has written about the Apache Wars for Encyclopedia Britannica and other publications, unravels the complex story of the conflict and the decades of uneasy peace that followed. ## Treasurer's Report

---

The table below shows 23-24 events that have been approved (\$72,192) and the 23-24 budget (\$57,223). An additional \$1,000 was budgeted for the Campus Food Bank and added to the budget (\$1,500 total for the year). \$2,000 was approved at the last meeting for the 2024 Paranormal event, but this has not yet been added to the report. It is expected all remaining events will come in under budget or postponed until next year (Legacy projects).

For the approved events, \$25,513 has been spent year-to-date, leaving \$31,710 to spend on upcoming events. YTD spending total was \$25,513 at the end of March, February was \$20,078, the additional \$5,435 was spent on

- **Bighorn Trek** → \$4,904 – \$944 TicTac candy for SAC to giveaway, \$1,484 for banners at the entrance, \$2,312 for lunch & snacks and \$164 for other supplies. Total spent on Bighorn Trek was \$4,954, \$50 for the cotton candy machine rental was included in the previous month's report.
- **Campus Food Bank** → \$480 – Replenish supplies in the campus food bank, total spent this year is \$980.
- **SAC Meeting Refreshments** → \$50 – Salad bar lunches for the March 13 SAC meeting, total spent this year is \$488.

Advisor positions will be hired once coordinator is on board
