Dear MCC Community,

As Fall semester approaches, MCC is modifying its approach to the pandemic. First and foremost, I still strongly encourage all students and employees to be vaccinated by the beginning of the fall semester. On August 2, all staff will return to campus workspaces in preparation of welcoming all students back to campus for the start of classes. Faculty will report on August 9. The past year's experiences, combined with vaccine availability, has affirmed that by taking necessary precautions we are able to learn and work on campus while minimizing risk. We look forward to increased campus activity with on-ground classes as scheduled and campus and community events resuming on-campus.

The following protocols and guidance will help to keep everyone safer during the coming year:

1. MCC is following CDC guidance including:
  - a. Masks and social distancing are required for employees who are not fully vaccinated.
  - b. Fully vaccinated individuals are not required to wear masks but are encouraged to if they wish.
2. MCC employees should stay home if they are not feeling well. Please complete a self-check prior to coming to work each morning.
3. MCC employees are required to complete a COVID report at [tools.mohave.edu](https://tools.mohave.edu) if they have COVID symptoms and/or receive positive COVID test results. MCC will continue contact tracing and notifying those exposed to COVID-19 indefinitely.
4. MCC employees and students are asked to continue cleaning/sanitizing work areas. MCC Facilities will monitor supply availability regularly.
5. PPE will be available to employees. Plexiglass barriers will be available to those working in public areas.
6. The campus fitness centers will remain closed until further notice.
