**I. Announcements/Additions to the Agenda**

**II. Approval of Minutes**

**A motion was made by Nicholas Magee, seconded by Megan Popowski, and carried unanimously to approve the minutes of the October 5, 2018, meeting.**

**III. Treasurer's Report**

Sunshine Boylan presented the Treasurer's Report. The Student Activities Council's (SAC's) balance as of September 30, 2018, is \$69,860.00. **A motion was made by Matthew Saginario, seconded by Zachary Strozyk, and carried unanimously to approve the Treasurer's Report.**

**A. Promotional Items Committee Report**

**C. Governing Board Candidates Forum – Develop Questions**

The SAC-sponsored Governing Board Candidates Forum will be held on Tuesday, October 30, at 6 p.m., in Building 600 on the Lake Havasu City Campus (LHC). Dean Woods encouraged all students to attend. She reminded members that this elected position will be a part of the Governing Board who will determine the next MCC president. Dean Woods asked the SAC members to come up with four questions to ask the candidates. Members agreed that they wanted to know each candidates' ideas on the future of enrollment, online learning, and technology at MCC.

**VI. New Business**

**A. New Club Approval – Student Art League**

**A motion was made by Zachary Strozyk, seconded by Megan Popowski, and carried unanimously to accept the Student Art League as a new LHC club under the LHC SAC umbrella.**

**B. Canopy Cover for Walkway**

Sunshine Boylan presented an idea about having a permanent canopy cover for the walkway behind the 200 building. The members agreed that it was a good idea. The item was tabled until the next meeting, when Ms. Boylan can bring back detailed information about costs, location, and placement of the canopy.

**C. Food Drive for St. Vincent de Paul**

**A motion was made by Matthew Saginario, seconded by Katlyn Ferrel, and carried unanimously to place two boxes on the campus – one in the Library and one in the Student Center – to collect donations year round for St. Vincent de Paul.** Sunshine Boylan will be the contact for St. Vincent de Paul and will handle getting the boxes to campus, monitoring each one, and delivering the donations.

**D. Student Survey**

Nicholas Magee agreed to tally the recent Welcome Back Bash survey results and bring that document to the next SAC meeting.
