She highlighted some of the other SAC-sponsored events and agreed to send out more information on the SAC Virtual Bash by the end of this week. VI. Old Business

A. Filming Station Updates

President Mahler stated that SAC approved a budget of up to \$4,000 for equipment and items for a student filming station to be set up in a room in the Library on the LHC Campus. Room 1211 was decided to be the room to be used. The activity request and ordering of the equipment are pending.

E. Student Nursing Association (SNA)

Beth Hooven, Advisor, reported that the club is working on their food drive that is planned for March 28 – April 12. Collection boxes will be on campus near the vending machines in the Student Center in Building 200, as well as in the Nursing lobby and throughout town. Nonperishable food items collected will be delivered to the Food Bank on Kiowa Ave. The club has just partnered with the Neil Kingman Campus and Sun Valley Pharmacy to help with administering Covid shots. The club is also working on a backpack drive that is anticipated to start at the beginning of May so the backpacks can be ready for students going back to school in the fall. SNA is also orchestrating screenings at

local elementary schools in the fall. She agreed to provide footage to Dean Ayon of activities SNA has been doing for the SAC promotional video.

This will allow the campus to have pinning ceremonies. The college will stay in Phase III, meeting the CDC guidelines of masks and social distancing, for an indefinite amount of time. Instruction is planning on ground classes for the fall semester.
