## VIII. New Business

### A. Student Re-Engagement Scavenger Hunt

The LHC Student Services Department is planning a fun activity for the Campus Fall Adopt-A-Week Initiative to engage students. They will host two eight-week scavenger hunt challenges for students to participate in a variety of tasks throughout the campus. Such tasks may include scheduling an appointment to meet their advisor, completing their 21/22 FAFSA, or scheduling an appointment to meet with a tutor or visit the campus library. The first challenge is scheduled August 23 – October 15, 2021, and the second challenge is scheduled October 18 – December 10, 2021. They would like to give the winner of each challenge a \$100 Amazon gift card and are requesting SAC to fund those gift cards.

**Vice President Adams moved, and Parliamentarian Flores Gomez seconded that motion, to approve purchasing two Amazon gift cards of \$100 each to be awarded as prizes to students for the Fall Student Re-Engagement Scavenger Hunts scheduled for August 23 – October 15, 2021, and October 18 – December 10, 2021. iii. Fall Pumpkin Fest

The annual Pumpkin Fest is cohosted by the LHC SAC and the MCC LHC Campus. It is a community outreach event to showcase the campus, introduce staff and student volunteers, establish the college as a fun, welcoming environment, be a service to the community, and provide a safe environment for seasonal trick-or-treat activities. Typically, there are games and activities for children and their families, candy, and a photo booth.

**Vice President Adams moved, and Parliamentarian Flores Gomez seconded that motion, to approve a budget not to exceed \$1,500 for food, entertainment, decorations, and prizes for the Pumpkin Fest event to be held on the LHC Campus on Friday, October 29, 2021. With no further discussion, the motion carried.**

iv. MCC Shines

MCC Shines is cohosted by the LHC SAC and the MCC LHC Campus. This is a community outreach to showcase the campus, introduce campus staff and student volunteers, establish college as a fun, welcoming environment, be a service to the community, and provide an enjoyable holiday event for the community. The event typically offers entertainment, food, a holiday tree-lighting ceremony, and a contest for the best decorated tree, a volunteer effort by departments and student clubs.

**Vice President Adams moved, and Parliamentarian Flores Gomez seconded that motion, to approve a budget not to exceed \$5,000 for food, entertainment, and decorations for the MCC Shines event to be held on Thursday, December 2, 2021. With no further discussion, the motion carried.**

v. Spring Student Listening Session with President

**Vice President Adams moved, and Parliamentarian Flores Gomez seconded that motion, to approve a budget not to exceed \$300 for food, cutlery, and tableware, for the Spring Student Listening Session with the President (Date TBD by President). With no further discussion, the motion carried.**

vi. Spring Welcome Back Bash

This is a fun event that the LHC SAC hosts to welcome students back to the spring semester.

**Vice President Adams moved, and Parliamentarian Flores Gomez seconded that motion, to approve holding a Spring Welcome Back Bash in the 2021-2022 Spring Semester (Date TBD) with a budget not to exceed \$4,500 for food, entertainment, prizes, and decorations. Without further discussion, the motion carried.**
