V. Assessment of Past Events

Members had a roundtable discussion to assess the recent 2018/2019 SAC-sponsored events. They were each presented with a spreadsheet that listed when and where each event was held, and the costs associated with each event. To better serve the whole student body and encourage more students to attend SAC-sponsored events, the members brainstormed and came up with the following ideas:

- Post upcoming events in each classroom on campus. Also post them in bathrooms.
- Create and display hand-made signs all around the campus on the actual day of the event and a few days before. Wanda Dickinson from SAL agreed to create future signs.
- Open events to students and their families.
- Advertise more for events.
- Have a photo booth at each event, as it seems to be a big hit for students.
- Create blast texts to students for upcoming events the day of the event and two days before.
- Move a portion of each event outside the building so students can see what's going on, or have big signs and balloons outside the venue so students know where the event is being held.

- Poll student body to see what days are most available for them to attend an event.
- Create a “spirit” committee to meet and greet students the first week of each semester and inform them of upcoming events and clubs. Have staff and faculty dress in MCC shirts that week.
- Have Boomer on campus the first week of each semester.
- Schedule the Welcome Back Bash at the beginning of the semester – perhaps the first week.
- Host tournaments between campus clubs.
- Create a Campus Life Community Group in Schoology.
- Have more collaboration across clubs for hosting events; i.e. Veterans Poetry event.
- Display events rotating on a TV in the Library for students to view when coming in.
- Create more activities for students in the Library.

VI. Old Business

A. CPR Classes for Students

At the 1/18/19 meeting, SAC approved an amount of up to \$750 to approve offering two “free to students” eight-hour CPR classes of eight students. The dates were confirmed for Friday, March 8, and Saturday, April 20. Members were asked again to fill the remaining slots.

Update after meeting: The March 8 CPR class was moved to March 15.

B. 80’s-Themed Dance

At the February 15, 2019, meeting, SAC approved hosting an 80’s-themed dance on April 25, 2019, at a budget amount of up to \$5,000 for the rental of a portable dance floor, a photo booth, entertainment, food, refreshments, and incidentals. Before beginning to plan the dance, the members agreed to survey the student body to see what their interest is in having the dance and whether they would like the dance open to just students, students and their guest, or students and their families, including children. Each member agreed to walk around with a survey sheet and to get the surveys back to Diane Aquino in the Campus Dean’s office by March 6.
