The meeting was called to order by Advisor Dean Jann Woods.

**I. Introductions**

- a. Everyone introduced themselves and Dean Woods announced the new SAC officers, who won by affirmation:

Dean Woods reviewed the Student Life Handbook and encouraged members to read it and review it often. She highlighted many sections, including SAC responsibilities, club responsibility of having updated information on file each year, advisor responsibilities, activity requests and risk definitions, and allowing 90 days in advance for activity requests. She asked the clubs to provide a copy of their minutes to Diane Aquino to post on the website.

**V. Fitness Center**

A motion was made by Austin Covington, seconded by Ashley Porter, and carried unanimously to approve the overage of \$1,174 for the Fitness Center Project.

**VI. Spooktacular Event**

A motion was made by Austin Covington, seconded by Anthony Jones, and carried unanimously to spend up to \$1,500 for supplies and decorations for the Spooktacular event on the Lake Havasu Campus on Friday, October 27.

**VII. Chat with the President**

A motion was made by Austin Covington, seconded by Anthony Jones, and carried unanimously to spend up to \$275 for food and incidentals for the Chat with the President event on November 1.

**VIII. MCC Shines**

A motion was made by Austin Covington, seconded by Anthony Jones, and carried unanimously to approve funding of up to \$1,500 for refreshments and incidentals for the MCC Shines event on December 7.

**IX. Club Reports**

**a. BDCC (Bighorn Decoders Computer Club)**

The club agreed to host one event per month. Their next event will be a Meet and Greet and Build a Computer event on Thursday, October 12, 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m., in Room 810.

The club voted in a new officer, Gary Baguio, as Vice President. Austin Covington announced that any student can join the club, whether they have a computer background or not.

Dean Woods announced that ASU would be having a Game Night on their campus on October 13, at 6 p.m. They have invited MCC students to attend.

**b. PTA (Physical Therapist Club)**

A suggestion was brought up to reactivate Quizlet, a mobile and web-based study application, for students. Dean Woods encouraged students to bring this issue to the President during the next Chat with the President event.

Another suggestion was to bring a quick print center to the Library.

**c. PTK (Phi Theta Kappa, Alpha Chi Chi)**

The club agreed to participate in the Spooktacular event on October 27. The club's Honors in Action project theme will be collectivism and they will have a survey on what students like doing. Then members will come up with groups that would accommodate their interests. The suggestions would be displayed on a white board in the Student Lounge. The discussion was tabled until the next SAC meeting when the club can come back with costs and specifics. PTK orientation will be held on October 27 and October 30.

**d. STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics Club)**

The club had their first meeting last week and came up with several ideas, including: hiking with geologists, Spooktacular project, astronomy nights, raspberry pie project, DIY week with the BDCC, dam trips, and a calligraphy project. President Austin Covington introduced the club's constitution to the SAC.

A motion was made by Karie Demyan and seconded by Anthony Jones for SAC to provide \$300 in seed money for the new club STEAM. The motion was voted down. A new motion was made by Jenna Krautkremer, seconded by Anthony Jones, and carried unanimously for SAC to provide \$500 in seed money for the new club STEAM.

Austin Covington suggested reviving the former piano lab. Dean Woods said there is no piano lab to revive. The two electric pianos on campus were used for a class that the college no longer teaches. We will look into repairing the keys on the piano in the student lounge.

e. **SAL (Student Art League)**

A motion was made by Austin Covington, seconded by Anthony Jones, and carried unanimously to match, once the proper paperwork is submitted, the SAL's fundraising monies of \$103 from their May 13 fundraiser at MetCalf Park in Kingman to be used for future SAL events.

f. **SNO (Student Nurse's Organization)**

No report given.

g. **SURGE TECH (Surgical Technology Club)**

The club has agreed to participate in the Spooktacular event and asked about times. After the Campus Event Committee meets on October 11, event times will be sent out to everyone.
