Dear MCC Community:

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work through the response to the COVID-19 outbreak. There are no confirmed cases connected to the college. However, given the rapidly changing developments, including the state/county emergency declarations and the rise in cases statewide, the college is moving to Stage 4 of its [Pandemic Response Plan](#).

This proactive step will help protect our students, employees and the communities we serve. It also follows CDC and State Health Department guidelines, and is in line with the response from community colleges across the state.

Classes that have been held on our campuses are being modified to limit face-to-face interactions and will resume on March 30th. Most courses will resume in an online format, with the potential exception of certain lab courses. These will be determined by individual instructors who will make sure social distancing protocols are implemented.

Faculty and staff will be in contact with students before classes resume to inform them of the changes. Students, please communicate with your instructors and advisors for answers to specific questions or contact the Call Center for general questions. Please check your email and Schoology regularly for messages from your instructors and college student services staff. Classes will continue through the end of the semester on May 11. Decisions about commencement and other end-of-year ceremonies are yet to be determined.

To help maintain a safe environment, MCC has canceled all campus and public events until further notice. All community and corporate education (non-credit) courses are also canceled until further notice. Student travel/field trips are also canceled, and employee travel has been restricted.

The campus libraries will remain open with modified hours for students and employees, but closed to the general public.

The academic success of our students is of utmost importance to MCC faculty and staff. The faculty and instructional staff are working diligently to provide quality learning opportunities for the completion of Spring 2020 courses and plan for a productive summer session.

MCC employees will continue to monitor federal, state, and county COVID-19 updates and will work with our community partners and health officials to maintain a safe and healthy campus. We encourage you to visit www.Mohave.edu/CoronavirusUpdates regularly for information. Emergency alerts will also be sent so you have timely updates.

We ask for your patience during this time and ask that you maintain an open line of communication by monitoring all emails, text messages, and phone calls from the College.
